

Existing Fire Ring


Mini marshmallows, or other candies to build an outlining rock boundary.

Don't forget your fire bucket - small cup of juice or water.



Foundation

Use 3 pretzel sticks, or a similar snack to represent large logs for the fire frame.




Tinder

Include small pretzel pieces, or other crumbly snacks to represent dry leaves, or wood shavings.




Kindling ~

Add broken middle-sized pretzel sticks, or a similar snack for the thin wood needed.



Alternative Fuel

Have raisins, licorice sticks, or something similar to add to represent charcoal needed for cooking, instead of large logs. Carrots, celery sticks, or pretzel sticks can be used to represent large logs.



Candy corn or Red Hots are placed on top to represent a successful fire.
